

The Final Sprint for European Rivers



#### By 2027 deadline:

- 90% of river basins studied will still be unhealthy
- 2 of 21 river basins might see good health by 2027

Water Framework Directive – Birds & Habitats Directives

EC 2019 overview: 2nd RBMPs will not bring significant progress status of protected areas



3rd RBMPs - Insufficient:

- Resources
- Capacity
- Time to assess RBMPs
- Integration conservation objectives RBMPs
- Coordination

Limited knowledge water requirements species & habitats






## Why does a free-flowing rivers target matter?





## **Europe** is ready for a free-flowing rivers target



Key Results participating countries:

72% national database of artificial barriers

52% priority list of barriers to improve river continuity

83% have national policies and/or strategies to restore river continuity

76% river continuity is 'rarely' mentioned in political discussions

# Nature on hold as EU puts premium on food security

2021 - 104,000 EU citizens asked to adopt restoration law

March 2022 – Announcement delayed

- +160 NGOs and 13,000 citizens immediately requested
- No delay
- Set a new launch date within a month
- No weakening



## Benefits of a legally binding free-flow target

















- Restore at least 25,000 km of free-flowing rivers by 2025
- Monitoring requirements to increase this target during the next review / adoption of separate legal act.
- 15% of rivers (178,000 km) restored to a free flowing state by 2030
- 25,000 km = 2% of EU rivers
- Prioritise river continuity in RBMPs accelerate WFD objectives
- Reorient from adapting existing barriers to complete removal
- Bridge the gap between ambitions and actions –Accelerate EU Biodiversity Strategy
